Project LEA (Leading Educators in Advancing Inclusive Early Education) is a post-Master's online graduate degree program (Education Specialist - Ed.S. level) funded by the U.S. Department of Education. Project LEA is housed at The University of Toledo, a leader in quality distance learning programs. Project LEA provides full tuition and an additional stipend for individuals who currently supervise early childhood special education services in Ohio or who would like to move into a supervisory position involving early childhood special education (ages 3-5 years).

We're currently accepting applications for our fourth cohort, with online classes beginning in January 2017 (spring semester) and concluding summer 2018.
