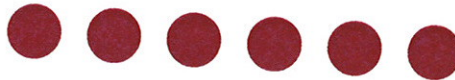

Perry Training Center

Located in Manchester West on the Perry Schools Campus, this all day program is designed for students who need more support in areas of independent living skills, leisure skills, pre-vocational skills and vocational skills.

Goals

- Full day program designed for 16-22 years olds who require intensive support.

- Classroom based vocational instruction; with a small staff to student ratio.

- Students will focus on hygiene, emergency situations, toileting skills, appropriate dress, basic living skills that will transfer to the work place.

- Students will begin to learn and master work appropriate behaviors such as voice level, personal space, solutions to emergency situations, wearing a uniform, following a work checklist, hygiene on the job, on task/off task behaviors, work speed, endurance, etc.
- Offers entry level skills practice

- Students will perform a series of jobs provided by school personnel, i.e. paper shredding, cleaning skills around school, organizational skills depending on student level. Students will be encouraged to create and run a small - in school business. There will also be opportunity for experience at community job sites.

- Speech and occupational therapy services will be provided directly at Perry focusing on students work experience.



Skills Based Training at Willoughby Tech

- Half day program for 14-22 year olds who require support in developing work skills, work behaviors and self-help skills
- Incorporates three distinct components for acquiring the skills necessary to be independent, contributing members of society

Community Living Skills component is designed to teach students a variety of daily living, leisure and social skills that are necessary to function more independently in home and community environments. It helps students to develop positive attitudes toward task completion, pride in accomplishments and increased self worth.

Supported Employment Training component provides students with vocational training in a simulated work environment. Students are taught personal and social employability skills that are essential for obtaining employment and achieving success in a working environment

Community Internship component provides students with continued career exploration and on-the-job training after a functional assessment of the student's interests and abilities. These experiences help them develop new work skills and reinforce personal and social employability skills. They engage in a continuum ranging from volunteering to working for pay.



Lake Front Lodge

Community Based Internship

- Full day program for 18-22 year olds
- Provides career exploration and job training in the community
- Begins the transition of students from school to work

While each day begins at Lakefront Lodge, students spend the majority of the school day at community experience sites such as Lake West Hospital, Endura Plastics, Kirtland Library, Lake Farmpark, Kirtland Senior Center, TriPoint Medical Center, Lakeland Community College and Lake County ESC.

Students receive training in grocery shopping, preparing simple meals, housekeeping skills, telephone skills, and personal grooming, as well as practice to maintain basic academics (money skills, math, and reading).

Students learn and experience Laketran's regular route buses as well as the Dial-A-Ride buses.
